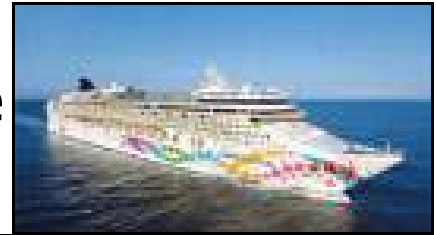

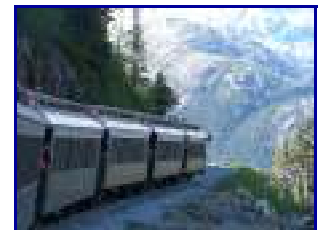

We're not kidding when we say we've got everything onboard. **Norwegian Pearl** was built for Freestyle Cruising, chances are you'll treasure everything about the award winning **Norwegian Pearl**. She's brand new and full of exciting options. Onboard, you'll find 12 unique places to eat and 11 exciting bars and lounges where you can just hang. There's even a bowling alley (a cruise industry first!) and rock climbing wall onboard. Choose from an impressive array of accommodations from the ultra luxurious Garden and Courtyard Villas to family-friendly connecting staterooms and suites. Finally, a vacation where you're free to whatever.

We'll spend an overnight in **Seattle** before our cruise. We can relax and going early eliminates the sailing day threat of missing the ship due to delayed flights. We can enjoy this great city and proceed leisurely to ship check-in Sunday mid-day. Sunday morning we'll take a driving tour of Seattle to view the city's landmarks.

**Inside Passage** - Located along the coast of British Columbia, the Inside Passage is the **longest sheltered inland waterway in the world**. It features everything you came to Alaska to see including rainforests, glaciers, fjords, orcas, whales, sea lions and white-capped peaks.

**Juneau, Alaska** - Juneau has a reputation as one of the most scenically beautiful cities in the United States. Overhead are the snowcapped peaks of Mt. Juneau and Mt. Roberts, while the Gastineau Channel provides a bustling waterfront for the city. In the city-center is a fine historical district with many buildings dating back to the early 1900s full of bars, gift shops, and restaurants. Also nearby is the eye-catching St. Nicholas Russian Orthodox Church, an octagonal-shaped building built in 1894. Juneau's many museums and mines in and around the city are worth the discovery. Given that it is known as the 'Gateway to the Glaciers', Juneau has several glaciers in the area - including the **Mendenhall Glacier**, Alaska's famous drive-in glacier, located just 13 miles from the city center. Touring the Juneau ice field by helicopter is a popular tour.

**Skagway, Alaska** - The eye-catching facade of the Arctic Brotherhood Hall, built in 1899 by gold miners who paid their dues in nuggets, is decorated with over twenty thousand pieces of driftwood. It houses the **Trail of 98 Museum**, displaying antiques from the Gold Rush. Take in the *Days of 98 Show*, an entertaining historical musical about Soapy Smith. Just north of town, the Gold Rush Cemetery is the final resting place of many of the stampeders. Guests can enjoy an optional train trip on the White Pass Railroad or a trip to Liarsville.

**Glacier Bay, Alaska** - Sixteen tidewater glaciers spilling out of the mountains, filling the sea with icebergs of all shapes, sizes and shades of blue have made **Glacier Bay National Park** an icy wilderness renowned throughout the world. It is an area of green forests, steep fjords, and icebergs. An added attraction is the variety of marine life including humpback whales, harbor seals, porpoises, and sea otters, while other wildlife includes brown and black bears, wolves, moose, mountain goats and over 200 species of birds.

**Ketchikan, Alaska** - Ketchikan, the sole community on Revillagigedo Island, five hundred miles north of Seattle, likes to be known as Alaska's "first city." Its historic downtown, wedged between the waters of the Tongass Narrows and forested Deer Mountain. Great souvenir shopping in this small town built into steep hills, and partly propped on wooden pilings, with boardwalks and wooden staircases as common thoroughfares and totem poles featured throughout. Don't miss the historic buildings on **Creek Street**, a rickety-looking boardwalk along Ketchikan Creek. A former red-light district now filled with shops and restaurants and Dolly's museum in what was once the town's most famous brothel. While most of the totem poles you see around town are replicas, the Totem Heritage Center exhibits a few genuine nineteenth-century examples, recovered from abandoned **Native villages**. Fourteen of the best replica totem poles and a re-built tribal house stand in Totem Bight State Park, breathtakingly set on a forested strip of coast overlooking the Narrows, ten miles north of town on the Tongass Highway. The Tlingit-run Saxman Totem Park, three miles south of town, displays the world's largest standing collection of poles and an authentic tribal house.

**Victoria, British Columbia** - *Condé Nast Traveler* magazine recently voted Victoria one of the **world's top ten cities** to visit, and world number one for ambience and environment. Our evening visit permits a trip along the waterfront area with it's quaint and likeable English feel and Victoria has more British-born residents than anywhere in Canada. It is a small, relaxed and pleasantly sophisticated place. Take a tour of Butchart Gardens or just enjoy some 900 hanging baskets that adorn much of the downtown area during the summer. Everything to see, as well as the best shops and restaurants, is within walking distance of the Inner Harbour area and the Old Town district behind it.

In each of these ports there will be many choices for optional tours offered by the cruise line and from dockside vendors. Do as much or as little in each port as you wish, we will have a cruise talk before departure and review the optional tours in each port. You will be cruising with Tina and Travis Henson. Tina has been an owner of the agency since 1991 and manages the Salem office. Travis is Director of Marketing at Kaskaskia College.
